- Campuses located near the cultural center of St. Louis, in proximity to museums, performance venues, and dining districts, one of the nation's largest civic parks





East End Transformation

- \$150 million expansion at WashU School of Medicine will include 160,000 sq. ft of state-of-the-art laboratory space






